**BAUER, (WALTER) PAPERS**

**Collection (1950-1976) of drafts, revisions of short stories, radio plays and typescripts of poems formerly in the possession of Walter Bauer (1904-1976) and Moffatt Woodside. Walter Bauer was a German poet and writer who emigrated to Canada in 1952. He was Professor of German at the University of Toronto.**

**He has published over 60 books. His biography of Norwegian explorer, Fritjof Nansen won the Albert Schweitzer prize.**
