- 1913, Apr. 3. Stephen Leacock, Montreal, to Mr. Bell. A.L.S. 2 folders 7 p. Discusses possibility of Bell's publishing firm getting Canadian rights to Behind the Beyond and bringing out a collection of sketches entitled A Holiday in Paris.
- [ca.1913] Stephen Leacock, Montreal to Mr.
 Bell. A.L.S. 1 leaf. Thanks Bell for sending some books; comments on good reviews for Behind the Beyond. "I am getting splendid reviews of Behind the Beyond to see your ad in Saturday Night. Good work! How are sales going?"
- 1914, Dec. Stephen Leacock, Montreal, P.Q. to Mr. Bell. A.L.S. 5 p. Discusses arrangements for royalties and rights on various of his works. "The future sales of <u>Sunshine Sketches</u> and <u>Behind the Beyond</u> in Canada will never be very large & I should think that the publisher would rather feel like giving me the higher per cent on these books for the sake of what might come after." With envelope postmarked Dec.17, 1914.
- 1915, Jan. 1. Stephen Leacock to Mr. Bell.
 A.L.S. Folder 3 p. Has just sent a
 6,000 word manuscript entitled <u>The Mind</u>
 of the <u>Master</u> to Jeff Jones in New York
 for publication; suggests Bell send for
 proofs and consider distributing the
 work in Canada. "Later if we ever came
 to publish a set of my works this and
 other stuff would go into a volume
 called <u>Literary Studies</u> or <u>Essays and</u>
 <u>Literary Studies</u>."
- 1915, Feb. 23. Card extending privileges of the McGill University Club House to W.C. Bell at the request of Stephen Leacock.

 Moonbeams. I don't think it's selling
 yet--stores seem dull --the reviews look
 good. Re Peace Makers. I'm still

 I shall go ahead ..."
- 1916, Dec. 20. Beatrix Leacock, Montreal, to Mr. Bell. A.N.S. Asks him to forward copies of two of Leacock's books to her mother; thanks him for sending her the Shakespeare books.

 Ont. to Bill. A.L.S. Folder 2 p.
 Thanks him for book; invites him up for
 a day's fishing.
- 1926, Apr. Stephen Leacock, Montreal to Billy. A.L.S. 2 p. Thanks Bill for sending the memoir of Susan Sibbald. With envelope postmarked April 15.
- 1932, June 22. Stephen Leacock, Orillia Ontario to W.C. Bell, Oxford Press; A.L.S. 2 p. Describes negotiations with several publishers over rights to Afternoons in Utopia. "I propose:--You and I go in fifty-fifty, sharing the risk thus ..."
- 1932, July 15. Stephen Leacock, Orillia, Ont., to Billy. A.L.S. 1 leaf. "So sorry. Quite understand. Post me back the <u>blurbs</u>. You and Charlie come up for a day in my sailboat ..."

1932, July 25. Stephen Leacock, to W.C. Bell, Oxford Press; Billy. A.L.S. 2 p. "The delay over the Canadian Edition of my Afternoons in Utopia is getting serious ... to save time please act for me. Offer it to Eayrs ..." Gives further instructions on the royalties sought.

[1932, Aug.] Stephen Leacock, Orillia, Ont.
 to W.C. Bell, Oakville, Ont; Billy.
 A.L.S. 1 leaf. "Please answer my letter
 of about ten days ago about my Utopia
