Topics include civil liberties, Canadian policy vis-à-vis the U.S., and the Annie Mae Aquash [also known as Anna Mae Pictou Aquash, Anna Mae Pictou, Mi'kmaq name Naguset Eask 'Sun Woman'] case. Papers were created in connection with The International Committee to Free South Vietnamese Political Prisoners from Detention, Torture, and Death, which was a committee of the Canadian Council of Churches, and Voice of Women, which is a non-governmental organization, and the Canadian Religious Society of Friends (Quakers). Includes correspondence, Vietnamese government publications, audio recordings of Toronto events, newspaper clippings, and printed matter.
