CALDWELL, (Lt. Col. E. Lloyd) PAPERS.

The papers of Lt. Col. Eugene Lloyd Caldwell were presented to the Library by Col. Caldwell's daughter-in-law, Mrs. Richard B.V. Caldwell, of 530 Carson Lane, Oakville, Ont. L6J 1E9, in November, 1980.

Born in Massachusetts, Col. Caldwell moved to Canada and became an officer in the Royal Canadian Dragoons. He taught at the Collège Militaire Royal in St Johns, Quebec and became an authority on the history of the area. At the time of his death which took place in Nova Scotia when he was 91, he had completed two histories of the Richelieu Valley, and a historical novel, Etoffe du Pays which is set the same area during the period of the American Revolution. The material is all unpublished.
