1901	Born in London, England, eldest child of William Herbert Wilkins (1874-1950) and Mary Eleanor Elliott (1873-1915)
1904	Immigrated to Qu'Appel, Saskatchewan where she lived on a farm for about seven years. Educated in Swift Current, and Toronto
1920-51	Editor and free-lance writer, contributing articles and short stories to major Canadian publications, such as <u>Chatelaine</u> , <u>The Family Herald and Weekly Star</u> , <u>Maclean's Magazine</u> , <u>Mayfair</u> , <u>The Montrealer</u> , <u>Saturday Night</u> , <u>The Star Weekly</u> . Continued to write for <u>Maclean's Magazine</u> and <u>Saturday Night</u> into the 1950's.

1931	Married Angus Campbell (1881-1962) surgeon at Toronto General Hospital and Professor Emeritus in Otolaryngology at University of Toronto
