Stillman Drake, a collector of the history and philosophy of science became interested in the writings of A.B. Johnson, 1786-1867, in 1938 after reading his <u>A treatise on language</u>. Johnson, a banker who wrote and spoke on many subjects including philosophy, finances, American government and politics, was born in Gosport, England, but lived most of his life in Utica, New York.

The collection contains typed transcripts made by Drake with holograph notes of Johnson pamphlets which he had been unable to buy because of their scarcity; correspondence with Johnson's descendants, scholars, and other Johnson collectors about Johnson, and the 1967 Johnson centennary conference in Utica, N.Y.

Many of Johnson's pamphlets and books are in the A. B. Johnson Collection.
