Mostly about his sermons and the texts preached on; some family matters; church matters; weather; religious outpourings. Includes slip laid in at p. 13.

p. 11: "this morning I was lively, this afternoon dull upon 1 J. 2, 12.

p. 6: wife and Polly.

p. 19: Wed. 27 April - the death of Nancy, youngest of his 3 children, of the measles, 2 years and 4 months old.

p. 21: "abundance of children have died in this town and neighbourhood of the measles and whooping cough."

p. 22: visit to his mother at Kidderminster. His sister "vastly distressed about her soul". The roads very rough.

p. 24: The paedobaptists - "find most of them unaccountably frigid and bigotted and severe".

p. 31: "Mr. Emery preached a brave substantial sermon from Matth. V, 4." p. 32: Correspondence. Receives "many scurrilous letters; lost the favour of many on account of my change of sentiment with regard to the ordinance of baptism". p. 43: "My dear partner was delivered of her 5th daughter, Esther", Sept. 13.
