# MS Fisher (Sidney T. and Charles Boddy) Collection Coll. 145

Manuscript material by Norman Douglas, Lord Dunsany, Sidney H. Sime and Rudyard Kipling collected by C.B. Fisher and S.T. Fisher. Also includes S.T. Fisher's correspondence relating to his book and print collections, as well as articles and other writings by him and by C.B. Fisher.

Presented to the library in 1973.

Extent: 25 boxes, 3.7 metres.

Charles and Sidney Fisher presented their collections of published works by Douglas, Dunsany and Kipling at the same time as the manuscripts listed here. The printed collections are listed separately in the public catalogue and form part of the Library's collections in English Literature.

Material relating to the history of the Fisher family in Canada and to the Humber River area where they first settled was donated by S.T. Fisher to the Metropolitan Toronto Library.

- To John Davenport. 1944-1947. 20 A.L.S., 1 postcard. Letters are brief notes on Douglas' travels, giving many changes of address, and mentioning mutual acquaintances; letters of March 1947 mention a projected visit by Dylan Thomas and relay warnings of the high cost of living, especially on Capri.
- To Mr. Dibber. [London, 1944/1945] A.L.S. 1 leaf. Confirms invitation.
- To Vyvyan Holland. 1929-1930. 23 A.L.S., 1 postcard. Comments on news of Charles Scott-Montcrieff and other mutual friends; discusses publication of <u>Capri</u> (1930) for which Holland has furnished a list of possible subscribers; discusses research for book on aphrodisiacs; thanks Holland for his help with this project. With letter dated Feb. 8, 1930 is a letter from G. Orioli to V. Holland thanking him for list of possible subscribers to <u>Capri</u> and enclosing a circular for the work.
- To Emilio Papa, Florence. London, Mar. 20, 1945. A.L.S. 1 leaf. Inquires about condition of his apartment; thanks him for storing some things.
- To Parish. Florence, Jan. 23, 1935. A.L.S. 1 leaf. Thanks him for sending tobacco and snuff. "On the day the first installment came I wrote to Lang ... begging him to thank you for me ..." Praises biography of grandfather.
- To Mr. Partridge. Florence, 1936. 2 T.L. Copies. Refers to his story in <u>Unprofessional Tales</u> and to his annotations of the text in <u>Conrad's</u> copy. Replies to inquiry about the whereabouts of his manuscripts.

- Unidentified Correspondent. Florence, Mar. 5, 1928. T.L.S. 1 leaf. Informs would be collector of the high prices his books fetch now.
- Unidentified correspondent. Florence, June 16, 1928. T.L.S. 1 leaf. Discusses <u>South Wind</u>. Correspondent's name has been erased. With this is typed extract from letter from Martin Secker to F.J. Warburg, dated Aug. 5, 1966, commenting on the Douglas letter.
- Unidentified correspondent. Athens, Oct. 29, 1935. T.L.S. 3 leaves. Name of correspondent has been cut out. Letter mentions the Italian political scene; thanks correspondent for sending copy of Houseman's introduction to Manilius.
- Circular advertising Douglas' book <u>How About Europe</u>. Florence, Nov. 1, 1929.

LORD DUNSANY MANUSCRIPT MATERIAL: [ca. 1960's] - 1970

This material, consisting of xeroxes of typescript unpublished [?] short stories, was formerly in the possession of Charles Boddy Fisher to whom Dunsany had given the typescripts in the 1950's with the L hope that Fisher could place them with an American publisher. When Fisher's efforts proved unsuccessful, he returned the typescripts to Dunsany, but retained his own xerox copies. Shortly afterwards Dunsany died and the whereabouts of the original typescripts is now unknown.

- To Certaine Odd Volumes [Charles Holme. London: 1890] A.L.S. Photostat. 1 leaf. Declines dinner invitation. Accompanied by envelope with holograph note signed by E.W. Martindell, dated Nov. 7, 1938, which explains the context of the note.
- To Bo Kipling. The Elms, Rottingdean [Eng.] A.N.S. Undated. Note asking his daughter to pour tea for him.
- To S. Low. [London] and Burwash, Sussex [Eng.] Undated and 1922. A.L.S., T.L.S. Earlier letter (A.L.S.) declines invitation. 1922 T.L.S. requests that addressee not sell a letter for charity but return it to Kipling; encloses a cheque for the charity instead.
- To Mr. Sanderson. Burwash, Sussex [Eng.] 1926-1927. 3 T.L.S. Comments on typescript of unpublished book on British statecraft which Sanderson has sent him. Urges publication.
