## BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Sadie Gairns, a native of Toronto, graduated with a B.A. in Household Science from University College, University of Toronto, in 1919. She then studied under J.R.R. Macleod and received an M.A. in Physiology in 1922. In the fall of 1922 she was hired as a research assistant to F.G. Banting with whom she worked closely for the next nineteen years. Her name appears with his on seven research papers, 1924-1934. She also came to assume increasing responsibility for the efficient operation of the Department of Medical Research at the Banting Institute. In the spring of 1941, following Banting's death, Sadie Gairns resigned from the Department. She died in Toronto on Nov. 3, 1986, "in her ninetieth year". (Obituary, Globe and Mail, Nov. 4, 1986)
