BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

On January 28, 1880, Thomas Gibbs Blackstock marriet Harriet (Hattie) Victoria **Gooderham** (1855-1951) in Toronto. Their children, William (Bill), Thomas (Tommie), Elizabeth (Lizzie), Gibbs, Barbara, George, Harriet (Hat), and Dorothy (Dot), mark the fifth generation of the Gibbs Blackstock family represented in this collection.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This fonds consists of papers and other record that represent five generations of the family's four main strains: the Tates, Gibbs, Blackstocks and the Gooderhams, and document the relationships between each as well as with friends and acquaintances. The earliest record is an English newspaper dated September 29, 1813, and the latest is a January 16, 1962 newspaper clipping related to George Tate Blackstock. The majority of correspondence and other personal papers were authored by Mary Hodge Blackstock. The papers in this collection were written mainly in Ontario and Quebec, with some from the United States and abroad. They have been arranged into the following series: correspondence, personal papers, newspaper clippings, images/photographs, family trees, notebooks/diaries, artefacts, and oversize material. Correspondence and personal papers have been arranged by author (and recipient); otherwise, documents are organized chronologically.

SOURCE OF ACQUISITION

The Gibbs Blackstock family papers were donated by two descendants of the family. The first deposit came from Barbara Cody on December 27, 1962 and forms MS. Col. 88. The second deposit came from C.M. Blackstock, 30 July 1998 and forms MS. Col. 421, which is not yet arranged and described.

ARRANGEMENT

The first accession of records arrived in folders and boxes arranged by the donor generally by creator, and then chronologically by date of creation. The archivist has imposed arrangement on the documents into the series mentioned above. Arrangement within series is chronological where possible; otherwise, arrangement is by form. When in doubt, original order was referred to.
