HAMBLETON, RONALD, 1917-

Ronald Hambleton, free lance writer, donated his papers to the University of Toronto in November, 1978.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The papers cover the professional life of Hambleton. The 25 boxes contain typescripts of his novels, published and unpublished, general and business correspondence, various articles, radio scripts, unpublished essays, plays, music reviews and magazine appearances. Included in his collection are tapes, recording his interviews with various writers. There are four photographs of Hambleton which were taken during CBC interview. His published works are arranged chronologically.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Ronald Hambleton was born in Preston, Lancashire, England in 1917 of working class parents. His family emigrated to Canada in 1924, and he grew up in Vancouver, B.C. Pushed out to work at the age of 14, he worked briefly as an office boy until the age of school leaving was extended to 16. He then continued his schooling for a short time, getting a good grounding in English, French and Latin. From the age of 16, he worked at a number of jobs, continuing his education by reading widely, and by attending night classes, notably in Italian. He acquired a wide knowledge of music and also involved himself in the Little Theatre Group. By 1936 he was selling the occasional poem, and continued to write in his spare time.

Hambleton spent a year in England, between June '39 and June '40, enlarging his experience and education. On his return to Canada, he stopped off in Toronto and has been Toronto based ever since.

He earned his bread and butter at first by doing odd jobs, and eventually worked his way into radio work. This remained his main source of income throughout his working career. He became very well known as a CBC script writer and interviewer. His other freelance jobs included being a book reviewer and music critic.

Hambleton did considerable creative work. As a poet he contributed to the following periodicals: Reading, Preview, First Statement, The Penguin Anthology of Canadian Poetry, Contemporary Verse.
