#### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

196 The English

The English painter, engraver, and poet, David Jones, was born in 1895 to James and Alice Jones at Brockley, Kent. He studied art at the Camberwell Art School from 1909 to 1914 and then in 1915 enlisted as a private in the Royal Welch Fusiliers. He fought in the trenches on the Western Front throughout the War, being wounded in 1916. In 1918 he was posted to Ireland. After demobilization in 1919, Jones attended the Westminster School of Art until 1921. In 1921 he was received into the Roman Catholic Church. From 1922 to 1924 he lived in Eric Gill's community of artists and craftsmen at Ditchling, Sussex, where he learnt the art of wood engraving, and joined the Ditchling Guild of St. Joseph and St. Dominic, founded in 1919 by Hilary Pepler and Eric Gill. When Eric Gill moved from Ditchling in 1924 Jones followed him to his new quarters at Capel-y-ffn in South Wales where he first met René Hague, then a young member of the community at Capel.

Jones spent several long periods at Capel during the next four years, interspersed with visits to the Benedictine monastery on Caldey Island off Tenby, Wales. In 1924 he became engaged to Gill's daughter, Petra, but the engagement lapsed after a number of years. In 1925 Jones provided the engravings for the first of several Golden Cockerel books he was to illustrate—Gulliver's Travels. In 1927 a joint exhibition of his work and that of Eric Gill was held at St. George's Gallery in London. In 1928 he began work on In Parenthesis.

In 1929 Jones followed the Gill family to Pigotts in Buckinghamshire where they had moved in 1928. Here he shared quarters with Rene Hague, and after Hauge married Eric Gill's daughter, Joan, lived with the couple in a small cottage at Pigotts. Jones suffered a nervous breakdown in 1932 and spent the following year recuperating and travelling to Egypt and Palestine. On his return to England in 1935 he began to spend periods of time at Rock Hall, near Alnwick in North numberland, the home of his friend and patron, Helen Sutherland, and at the Fort Hotel in Sidmouth, Devon where another close friend, Prudence Pelham, visited him.

In 1937 In Parenthesis was published. In 1940-41 the Tate Gallery acquired several of his paintings. Jones moved to London in 1940 and remained there until he suffered another breakdown in 1946. He spent the next year under psychiatric care at Bowden House, in Harrow-on-the-Hill, where he continued to write and paint. By the end of 1947 he was able to move to his own quarters at Northwick Lodge in Harrow, the town in which he was to spend the remainder of his life.

In 1952 The Anathemata (first conceived when he visited Jerusalem in 1933) was published and in 1959 Epoch and Artist appeared. From 1966 of he worked on a series of poems eventually published in 1974 in a collection entitled The Sleeping Lord and other Fragments. In 1970 he suffered a stroke and a fall and was admitted to the Calvary Nursing Home in Harrow where he lived until his death in Oct. 1974.

# BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

David Jones' friendship with the printer and author René Hague (b. 1905) goes back to their first meeting in 1924 at Eric Gill's community at Capel. Hague lived at Capel until 1928, moved to Pigotts in 1929, and began operating a printing press there with Eric Gill. In 1930 Hague married Eric Gill's daughter, Joan and moved into a small cottage at Pigotts which was shared for several years with David Jones. The friendship continued throughout Jones life. René Hague continued to work as a printer and in 1952 he printed In Parenthesis. René Hague is also the author of three works on David Jones: David Jones (University of Wales Press, 1975); A Commentary on 'The Anathemata' of David Jones (Christopher Skelton, 1977); and Dai Greatcoat; a self-portrait of David Jones in his letters (Faber, 1980)

#### SCOPE

The René Hague correspondence falls into two sections. The early letters date from 1931 to 1936, when Jones and Hague were intimate friends, frequently sharing the same living quarters. Many of these letters have drawings and sketches. These are followed by a gap of twenty-four years when only three letters have been preserved, and then by a group of letters beginning in 1960 and increasing in frequency by the 1970's. The later correspondence, from 1973 and 1974, consists of very lengthy letters containing reminiscences of Jones' past experience and discussing questions raised by René Hague in the course of writing his Commentary on The Anathemata. René Hague used portions from the correspondence in this collection in his book Dai Greatcoat; but much material still remains unpublished.

The letters to William Blissett, 1954 to 1973, have all been published in his A long conversation (Oxford, 1981), a memoir of David Jones.
