Dates of creation: 1898-1924

Extent: 75 cm of textual records. -- 24 photographs (8 boxes)

Biographical sketch: In July 1898 Prince Petr Kropotkin, the Russian geographer, author and revolutionary, wrote to Mavor drawing his attention to the plight of the Doukhobors, a Russian peasant religious sect, who were being persecuted by the Russian government for their egalitarian and pacifist views. Kropotkin, who had visited the North-West of Canada the previous year, asked Mavor to investigate the possibility of Doukhobor immigration to Canada. Mavor's efforts on behalf of the sect culminated in the arrival of the first settlers in Saskatchewan early in 1899. Until his death in 1925 Mavor continued to take an interest in the welfare of the Doukhobors and intercede on their behalf with government authorities. Mavor's active involvement is centered on four separate episodes:

- the preliminary negotiations and initial arrival and settlement of the Doukhobors, including the 1902 "pilgrimage" when 2000 Doukhobors temporarily deserted their villages, and Mavor's visits to the settlements in 1899 and 1904 (1898-1904)
- the confiscation by the government of two-thirds of Doukhobor land in Saskatchewan, and the subsequent relocation of some 5000 community Doukhobors, under the leadership of Petr Verigin, to the Kootenay region of British Columbia (1910) and the subsequent attempts of the Doukhobors to claim compensation for their losses (1912-1913)
- the attempt by the federal government to expropriate Doukhobor lands in order to make it available to returning soldiers after World War I (1919)
- the refusal of the Doukhobors to pay income tax, first instituted in 1917 to finance World War I expenditures (1921-1922)

Custodial history: Almost the whole of the original correspondence prior to April 1904 was destroyed by fire while still in the custody of the owner, James Mavor. A note by Mavor at the beginning of scrapbook III records: The originals of many of the letters in the following list together with a large number of other papers connected with the immigration of the Doukhobors were sent to the binders in April 1904 and unfortunately destroyed in the Great Fire of Toronto which occurred a few days afterwards".

Scope and Contents: The series consists primarily of correspondence concerning Doukhobor affairs, from the initial inquiry by Petr Kropotkin to Mavor in July 1898 to the arrival of 7500 Doukhobors in 1899-1900, and the first years of their settlement in Saskatchewan. Important correspondents include government officials such Clifford Sifton and James A. Smart of the federal Department of the Interior and W.F. McCreary, Commissioner of Immigration in Winnipeg, and Doukhobor spokesmen and leaders such as Leo Tolstoy, Aylmer Maude, Vladimir Chertkov, D. Khilkov and Petr Verigin. Subsequent correspondence is mainly concerned with the period 1906-1907 and 1919 when Doukhobor communites were under threat of expropriation of their lands.

The series also contains printed material, including pamphlets and other articles, on the Doukhbors; Mavor's own notes and reports, including a daybook kept during his trip to Western Canada in 1899; and photographs of Doukhobor settlements in Canada.

Source of supplied title: Title based on contents of series.

Physical description note: Holograph correspondence (some carbon copies) and notes; holograph and typescript copies of correspondence; also includes some printed materials, clippings, and photographs.

Arrangement note: Mavor organized his correspondence chronologically by date received, which means that correspondence from abroad is generally found later in the sequence than local correspondence of the same date. He kept carbon copies of his own outgoing correspondence, and also regularly made typescript copies of letters received. He then pasted the letters, including enclosures and occasionally supporting documentation such as newspaper clippings, into scrapbooks, often with a table of contents indexing the letters by number at the beginning of each volume. The series also includes looseleaf and printed material which was not originally included in scrapbooks, arranged chronologically or thematically. Photographs were removed from the original scrapbooks for conservations reasons, and are boxed separately (box 40).

Language: Some of the material is in Russian.

Availability of other formats: The majority of the correspondence in this series has been microfilmed. [Microfilm duplicate 46]

Restrictions on access note: No restrictions on access.

Finding aid: Index to each volume of the correspondence is available (box 39).

Associated material: An early draft of the Doukhobor chapter in Mavor's memoirs My Windows on the Street of the World is found in the series of that name (file 68 of the Mavor papers).

Custodial history: The original scrapbook has been disbound by the Library due to conservation requirements. The correspondence has been transferred to folders (box 35A, folders 1-11).

Scope and content: File consists of a scrapbook which Mavor titled "Correspondence on Doukhobor Affairs 1898-1899, Vol. I". The file consists chiefly of 98 numbered letters, in 11 folders. Folders 1-2 consist of two versions of Mavor's index to the correspondence, titled "Catalogue of Correspondence regarding the Immigration of the Doukhobors into Canada from July 1898 to February 1899". One list includes Mavor's manuscript additions and corrections; the other list is a clean copy of the first. Folders 3 through 9 contain the correspondence. Seven of the letters, though they have been assigned a number and are included in Mavor's index and known to have existed, were evidently not transcribed and are therefore missing. Folder 10 contains a typescript entitled: "Notes of conversations with [Paul] Planedin. November 1902. Translated by [Joseph] Dieterichs". Folder 11 contains a portion of the original scrapbook cover.

The correspondence chiefly concerns various financial and other arrangements for the migration of the Doukhobors negotiated with the federal Minister of the Interior, Clifford Sifton, and his deputy minister James Smart, as well as with interested supporters, chiefly Vladimir Chertkov and other members of the Tolstoyan community in Purleigh, Essex, known as the English Committee.

The principal correspondents include Petr Kropotkin, Vladimir Chertkov, William Mulock, Patrick Geddes, Clifford Sifton, Leo Tolstoy, Aylmer Maude, James A. Smart, Samuel Biddle, Frank Pedley, D. Khilkov, Herbert P. Archer.

Physical description note: The correspondence consists of carbon typescript copies (originals destroyed in fire - see custodial history note for Doukhobor series). Some of the correspondence is duplicated in volume 3.

Arrangement note: Correspondence is arranged chronologically, by date received.

Custodial history: The original scrapbook has been disbound by the Library due to conservation requirements. The correspondence has been transferred to folders (box 35A, folders 12-31).

Scope and content: File consists of a scrapbook which Mavor titled "Doukhobor Affairs 1907 - Correspondence and Documents / James Mavor". The file consists chiefly of 73 numbered letters. At the beginning (folders 12-15) is a sequence of unnumbered correspondence, commencing with an official typescript copy on Dept. of the Interior letterhead, of a letter from Aylmer Maude to James A. Smart dated 1 December 1898 (also found as letter 77 in folder 8, vol. I), as well as copies of other correspondence from the Dept. of the Interior containing details of the Doukhobor settlements, mainly dating from 1906. Also found here is a copy of a letter from Chertkov to Mr. Brooks, dated 9 May 1907 and a short note from Clifford Sifton to Mavor dated 3 June 1907. Folders 16 through 30 contain the main sequence of the correspondence, dated 14 January 1907 to 22 May 1907.

Custodial history: Several original photographs dated 1904 were removed from the scrapbook by the Library, for conservation, and were transferred to the end of the Doukhobor series with the other miscellaneous material (box 40).

Scope and content: File consists of a bound scrapbook which Mavor titled "Correspondence and Papers relating to the Emigration of the Doukhobortsi into Canada 1898- / James Mavor, Toronto". The first part of the volume is a duplicate of 22 of the 98 letters found in scrapbook Volume I (10 July 1898 - 6 February 1899) plus one letter dated 27 August 1898 which did not appear in vol. I. These, like the correspondence in vol. I, are all typescript copies. However, they are not carbon copies of the letters in the vol. I; they have been typed at a different time and some include manuscript notes by Mavor. It is likely that the copies in this scrapbook are the earlier version, as occasionally revisions made by Mavor here in manuscript have been incorporated into the typescript copy found in vol. I.

The correspondence then continues with letters numbered 99 to 128, dated 17 April 1899 - 21 June 1904. At the end is one unnumbered letter from Petr Verigin to Mavor dated 25 March 1905. The scrapbook also includes many contemporary newspaper clippings and other printed documentation, and one original photograph, of Nikolas Zibarov, dated 1902. Laid in to the volume at the back are three letters and 2 newspaper clippings dating from 1924.

The principal correspondents include W.F. McCreary, Herbert P. Archer, Petr Kropotkin, James A. Smart, Aylmer Maude, Joseph Dietrichs, Petr Verigin.

Physical description note: The duplicate correspondence from the first series in vol. I consists of typescripts. Scope and content: File consists of a scrapbook which Mavor titled, on the cover, "The Doukhobors Documents Vol. IV. 1919". The title page reads: Affair No. 4. The Doukhobors Documents. Vol. IV. 1919". The file consists chiefly of letters numbered 292-406, dated 28 February 1919 to 15 July 1919. There are also a few unnumbered letters, from the same time period. The correspondence is chiefly that resulting from Mavor's "Open Letter to Sir Thomas White, Acting Prime Minister of Canada", dated 1 May 1919, which was printed and sent to all members of the Senate and House of Commons, as well as to the press. The file also includes printed documentation and contemporary newspaper clippings.

The principal correspondents include Simeon Reibin, Petr Verigin, Arthur Meighen, F. W. Godsal, Thomas White, Martin Burrell, F. A. Crerar, B. E. Chaffey, B. E. Paterson.

The first concerns the expropriation of Doukhobor land in Saskatchewan and the attempts to claim compensation from the federal Dept. of the Interior following the Doukhobor move to British Columbia, 1908-1914 (folders 1-39). The second concerns the refusal of the Doukhobors to pay the newly imposed income tax instituted by the federal government in an effort to raise funds for war debts, 1919-1920 (folder 40). The file also includes printed documentation and contemporary newspaper clippings.

Physical description note: The incoming letters are originals, and the outgoing letters are carbon copies of the holograph originals.

Arrangement note: The first part (1908-1914) of the correspondence is arranged chronologically; the second portion (1919-1922) is arranged by name of correspondent.

Scope and content: The file consists of correspondence, reports and transcripts of interviews copied from the files of the Department of the Interior. The documents detail the dispute between the federal government and the Doukhobors, concerning the application of certain terms of the Dominion Land Act which resulted in the expropriation of Doukhobor lands in Saskatchewan. It includes information on the cancellation of homestead grants, details of holdings and other documentation relating to the Commission for Investigating Doukhobor claims, chaired by John McDougall. Mavor had visited the Dept. of the Interior office in Ottawa in April 1907 in order to collect information on the dispute. His abstracts and notes on items he saw at the department, as well as notes on which items he would like to have copied for his own files, are included in "Partial Calendar of Papers in the file of Doukhobor Affairs in the Department of the Interior. File from November 1906 - April 1907" (located in vol. [II], box 35A, folder 24).

The principal correspondents include Wilfrid Laurier, Frank Oliver, John McDougall, J. K. Johnston and other ministry officials.

conflicts with Canadian authorities. A confidential draft of his "Report on Immigration" (1900) written for the Dept. of the Interior, is also included. Also included are two notebooks - one detailing his trip to Western Canada and his visit to Doukhobor settlements in 1899, and another in which he kept his own memoranda on Doukhobor questions, including notes of important conversations with Paul Planedin in 1902 and with Simeon Reibin in April 1907, along with translations of Russian works. Other significant translations in this file are: *To America with the Doukhobors* by L. A. Soulerjitsky, translated by Nathan Schachnov (1907) and English translations of letters by Petr Verigin written during Verigin's exile in Siberia, contained in Chertkov and Bonch-Brievitch's *Materials for the History of the Russian Sects* (1907). The file also contains a small amount of correspondence which was not included in the bound scrapbooks of correspondence.

Scope and content: The file consists of 23 photographs. Four photographs date from Mavor's 1899 visit to Doukhobor settlements in Saskatchewan, and were labelled by him as follows:

- Doukhobor village people collected to sing to Mavor on his crossing the White Sand River on a raft
- Doukhobor women making village street
- Doukhobor women making flax
- Doukhobor lumber camp

Another photograph is titled: "The Doukhobor pilgrims entering Yorkton Oct. 28, 1902", copyright Thomas V. Simpson.

The other 18 photographs are of Doukhobor settlements in British Columbia, ca. 1912, and depict agricultural and village life. One photo shows Petr Verigin in his garden. They are all stamped on the verso: The Christian Community of Universal Brotherhood, Ltd.
