Biographical sketch:

John Alexander (Jack) McNeil was born in Angus, Ontario in 1876. After 6 years of schooling he commenced work as a printer's devil for the weekly Barrie Gazette. In 1892 he moved to Toronto where he became a typesetter for The Empire. Later, in London, Ont., while taking part in a printer's strike, he proved his worth as a reporter when the strikers published their own paper, and he was hired in 1900 as a reporter for the London Advertiser. His work as a dramatic reviewer attracted attention, and he was hired as a drama critic and general reporter for the Toronto Mail and Empire in 1903.

His rise was rapid. He was soon in charge of the evening edition of the newspaper, subsequently abandoned, and in 1911 he beame the first night correspondent in Toronto of the newly organized Canadian Press. In 1913 he joined the staff of the Montreal <u>Gazette</u>. Once again he rose rapidly, moving from reporter to managing editor by 1927. He became a director of the Canadian Press the same year and in 1939 became general manager upon the retirement of J.F.V. Livesay. He directed the CP through the difficult war years, retiring in 1945.

While he made his living as a newspaperman, his real love was the theatre. He collected books, records and photos, many of which were autographed by the world's leading actors. He was personally acquainted with many of the members of the D'Oyly Carte Company which staged Gilbert and Sullivan and was a renowned authority on the operattas, as well as on eighteenth century music and plays.

He died in Toronto October 18, 1964.
