## MILLS FAMILY PAPERS

#### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

William Mills graduated with a B.A. degree from Trinity College, Dublin, in 1833. In August 1835 he was ordained in the Anglican Church as a Deacon; in Oct. 1836 as a priest. In 1837 he was appointed Assistant Curate to the Rev. John R. Tarleton, Rector of the Parish of Tyholland in the Diocese of Clogher. In 1841 he left Tyholland to become Assistant Chaplin of Trinity Church in Dublin. The grateful parishioners of Tyholland presented him with an address of appreciation and a silver salver as a token of esteem. At some point during his curacy at Tyholland, he married Jane Elizabeth Dillon, of Gort. In 1842 their only child, Samuel Dillon, was born. William Mills served as Assistant Chaplin at Trinity Church until 1846 when he was appointed curate at In March of 1848 he died at Kells.

Samuel Dillon Mills, son of William Mills and Jane Elizabeth Dillon, was born in Dublin in 1842. He attended the Royal School of Science in Dublin from 1860 to 1864. In 1864 he emigrated from Dublin to Toronto. He acquired property near Niagara and by 1866 had begun farming. In 1873 he returned to Ireland and England for a visit. the same year he married Mary Morson, of Hamilton, with whom he was to have five children. By 1877 he was living in Hamilton, working as a mining geologist and surveyor. He investigated several properties in Ontario and Nova Scotia and the family lived for a while near Windsor in Nova Scotia. Later, Dillon-Mills, as he preferred to be named, became superintendent and manager of various blast furnaces and foundries in the United States. In 1885 his wife died. By 1889 he was running the Vulcan Furnace Company's foundry in Michigan. In the 1890's he was in Toronto, running the Junction Foundry Company until its financial failure in 1898. Throughout his life Dillon-Mills retained a keen scientific interest, as his notebooks indicate, and he was an active member of the Royal Canadian Institute and the Toronto Natural History Society. In addition he served as Secretary of the Toronto branch of the Canadian Mining Institute. He was also Chairman of the Location Committee of the Toronto Playgrounds Association in 1909 and continued to be involved with this Association in 1916. He spent his declining years in Toronto, at the home of his daughter, Grace Walker, and died in 1927.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Samuel Dillon-Mills received an entry in Morgan's Canadian Men and Women of the Time (1912).

BOX 1 A. CORRESPONDENCE AND BIOGRAPHICAL DOCUMENTS, 1826-1857.

Much of the correspondence relates to Mills' work as a curate and discusses various curacies which may become available for him. Frequent correspondents include: John Rotheram Tarleton, Rector of Tyholland, where Mills was curate from 1837 to 1841; John Gregg, Rector of Trinity Church, Dublin, where Mills was curate from 1841 to 1845; and Edward A. Stopford, Archdeacon of Kells, where Mills served as curate from 1846 until his death in 1848.

Documents include letters of ordination, appointments to curacies, addresses of appreciation given to Mills at his departure from the parish of Tyholland and from Trinity Church, Dublin, and other biographical material.
