In Canada, she taught in the Department of English at the University of Toronto from 1972 to 1987, and now lives and works in Devon. She was Honorary Research Fellow at the Centre for Women's Studies at Exeter University, England from 1995 to 2001, and a member of the Literary Panel of the Arts Council of England from 1993 to 1996. from She has written collaboratively with Gillian Hanscombe, and has organized and participated in numerous writer's workshops. She sees the World Wide Web as an analogue to and as a part of the common cultural space we all inhabit. Her work includes both prose and poetry, though she is best known perhaps as a fabulist. Her work encompasses issues such as gender, sexual orientation and the injustices arising from an imbalance of power between various social groups.
