NORTHWAY (MARY L) PAPERS

A collection of Mary Northway's personal and professional papers. These include her work as a lecturer in the Department of Psychology at the University of Toronto 1933-1958, but mainly relate to her career as a lecturer and eventually director of research of the Institute of Child Study, University of Toronto, 1938-1968; and her work as director of Brora Institute, 1969-78. Included are research notes and charts relating to her work in sociometry, and drafts, manuscripts and typescripts of many of her writings, as well as copies of her published works. Related collections are the W.E. Blatz collection in the Fisher Library and the Northway papers at Trent University.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mary Louise Northway was born in Toronto, May 28, 1909, daughter of Arthur Garfield Northway and his wife Lucy (MacKellar) Northway. Her grandfather was John Neathern Northway, founder of the Northway chain of clothing stores which flourished in a number of Ontario towns. His wife was Catherine (Mackay) Northway whose family had emigrated from Brora, Sutherlandshire, during the Highland clearances.

Mary Northway received her early education in Toronto at Rosedale Public School, Branksome Hall and Bishop Strachan School. She entered the University of Toronto, receiving her B.A. in Honours Psychology in 1933, and her M.A. in the same subject in 1936. During 1935-36 she studied under Sir Frederick Bartlett at Cambridge, England. In 1939 she received her Ph.D. from the University of Toronto, her thesis subject being "Bartlett's concept of the Schema", later published in The British Journal of Psychology.

Northway joined the staff of the Department of Psychology at the University of Toronto in 1933 as a Reader, and rose to Associate Professor before she left the Department in 1963. From 1938 to 1968 she was a lecturer at the Institute of Child Study where she was supervisor of research from 1951-1968. Her specialty was sociometry, and, starting in 1939, she developed Canadian research and publication in the sociometry of childhood. With the use of the computer in the early 60's, the new co-ordinated longitudinal study at the Institute of Child Study became internationally known. This study was at first supported by the University and by research grants, notably the Ontario Mental Health Foundation. However changes in the late 1960's in the direction of University support were to cause Mary Northway and other retiring staff members of the I.C.S. to turn elsewhere for support.

Running concurrently with her academic career was Northway's interest in and promotion of camping. She was a counselor and later programme director at Glen Bernard Camp from 1931-39. She ran a canoe training camp from 1941-50, and was a member of the Ontario, Canadian, and American Camping Associations. She was a director of research and education for the Ontario Camping

Association from 1930 into the 1940's, and initiated an archives committee in 1967 for it culminating in the archives of the Association being established at Trent University, Peterborough. Northway wrote many articles in Canadian and American camping magazines, as well as two books for camp counselors: Charting the Counselor's Course, 1940; and the Camp Counselor's Book in collaboration with Barry Lowes in 1963.

In 1948 Northway became a director of the Northway Company Ltd. From 1960 to 1963 she was president. In the latter year the Northway Company was wound up, and out of the assets the Neathern Trust was created. At this time she acquired the Northway papers which became the basis of Alan Wilson's book, John Northway: A Blue Serge Canadian. The Northway papers were deposited in the Trent University Archives.

The winding up of the Northway Company came when Northway was deeply involved in the new co-ordinated longitudinal studies at the I.C.S. The illness and death of Dr. Blatz in 1964 coupled with changes at the University resulted in this programme being greatly curtailed in personnel, and in financial and moral support. Northway retired from the University in 1968, and in 1969 she was able to finance the setting up of the Brora Centre out of the assets of the Northway Company. Two years later the Institute of Child Study was placed under the jurisdiction of the College of Education with its primary role defined as teaching rather than research.

The Brora Centre was set up by Mary Northway and Dorothy A. Millichamp, to continue the academic work and personal interests of the retiring staff of the Institute. The Centre also provided facilities for the Blatz Memorial which had been instigated by Northway in 1965, for the Neathern Trust, set up in 1963, as well as for research and counselling. The Centre continued until 1978.

The W.E. Blatz Memorial was set up in 1965 to continue the interests of Blatz in child study and education. Six visiting lecturers came to Toronto, research studies continued, and the Blatz

Era research papers and documents were preserved, largely at Northway's instigation.

She died on February 27, 1978.

During Mary Northway's last years, she contributed much by giving interviews which were taped for archival purposes. Of these she considered the most important to be: Experience of a Psychologist, for the Canadian Psychological Association Archives; Life at the University of Toronto for the University Archives; and Contacts with J.L. Moreno and the Development of Sociometry in Canada, for the Moreno Institute Archives.

Northway also arranged for the placing of various collections of papers in archival centres. As has been already mentioned, the Northway Family papers and the Ontario Camping Archives are at Trent University. The Blatz Research papers, 1925-1960, and the documents of the Blatz Era including tape recordings of 20 of its participants, and Northway's personal and academic papers are in the Thomas Fisher Library, University of Toronto.

Always in demand as a speaker and lecturer and as a contributor to periodicals, Northway wrote literally dozens of articles as well as monographs on child study and camping. A twelve page bibliography of her work may be found in Box 3 of the Collection, and another copy is filed in Box 49.

SERIES 4. BRORA INSTITUTE

Brora, a non-profit organization, was set up in March 1969, and closed in May 1978. Its purpose was to enable former staff members of the Institute of Child Studies to continue the kind of research which the University of Toronto could no longer fund. Brora was incorporated under the Corporations Act of Ontario, registered as a charitable organization. The main source of revenue was The Neathern Trust, part of the Northway estate, and grants from various funding agencies.
