

David G. Rempel's Papers.

Writing and correspondence on Mennonite history in pre-Revolutionary Russia

Scope and Content: Contains the manuscripts and research of David G. Rempel, primarily on the topic of Mennonite life in pre-Revolutionary Russia. This collection includes the manuscripts of Rempel's brother Johann (John) Gerhard Rempel, which have been translated by Rempel. As well as books, articles, manuscripts, diaries and other writing on the topic of Mennonites in Russia, and more widely, which was collected by Rempel for research purposes. In addition, the collection contains a large amount of Rempel's correspondence with family, friends, scholars and researchers on the topic of Mennonite history.

Biographical Information: David Gerhard Rempel was born on the 30th November 1899 in Nieder-Chortitza, a German-speaking Mennonite colony in Southern Russia (now Ukraine), to Gerhard Rempel (1863-1919) and Maria Pauls (1867-1920). Rempel graduated from high school in 1917 and traveled to Barvenkovo to study at a commercial school in the hopes that he could take over the family grain business. However, the rise of political issues following the abdication of Tsar Nicholas II and the beginning of the Russian Civil War forced Rempel to return home, where he enrolled in teacher's training school. From October to December 1919, the colony was occupied by Nestor Mahkno's Anarchist Black Army and caused a widespread typhus epidemic, which would claim the lives of Rempel's parents and his brother, Heinrich. Rempel taught elementary school until 1922, when he was removed from the post by Soviet authorities. In 1923, David and his brothers, John and Jacob immigrated to Canada under a Canadian relief program for Mennonites and settled in Saskatchewan. Rempel studied at the Rosthern German-English Academy before he was selected, along with six other Russian-born Mennonite men, to study at Bluffton College in Ohio in 1924.

Upon graduation he commenced graduate studies at the University of Wisconsin at Madison, earning a Master's degree in Political Science. He worked as a translator at the Hoover Library of Stanford University, where he went on to complete his Ph.D. in 1933. His dissertation, "The Mennonite Colonies in Russia: a Study of their Settlement and Economic Development from 1789 to 1914" set the standard for Mennonite historical scholarship. From 1934 to 1964, David Rempel was employed as a professor at the College of San Mateo in suburban San Francisco. His tenure at the college was interrupted for service in the United States Strategic Air Force in London, where he served as a historian during the Second World War.

David Rempel returned to the Soviet Union in 1962 to do research in the State Historical Archives in Leningrad (now St. Petersburg) and the Archive of Ancient Documents in Moscow, where he was granted unprecedented access to historical materials that had hitherto been thought lost. At these two institutions, Rempel was able to copy 10,000 pages onto microfilm.

David G. Rempel spent the majority of his life meticulously collecting documents about Mennonite history in pre-revolutionary Russia. He died in Menlo Park California on 27 June 1992 at the age of 93. As Canada was the first country to open its borders to the Mennonites, Rempel wished that his papers return to the nation that had done the most to rescue his people. His records are held at the Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library, the Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies (Winnipeg), the Mennonite Heritage Centre (Winnipeg), and Conrad Grebel University College (Waterloo).
