Scope and Content: Includes minute books, membership lists, financial records, final typescripts of lectures, correspondence, committee minutes and reports, scrapbooks, clippings, printed materials.

Administrative History: Founded in Toronto in 1849 as the Canadian Institute by a group of engineers, surveyors, and civil engineers as a professional society that would include all architects, surveyors, and engineers in Ontario. In 1850 it was agreed include all whose pursuits or studies were of a kindred character". Incorporated in 1851, became the Royal Canadian Institute by Royal charter in 1914. Continues to hold public meetings and lectures.

The Records were transferred to the Library from the Royal Canadian Institute offices in 1985 and 1990. Some historical files are at the Archives of Ontario. The Institute's publications are also in the Library.
