Manuscripts, typescripts and tearsheets of published novels and short stories, part of an unpublished autobiography, drawings and sketches, some correspondence with publishers.

Extent of collection: 44 boxes.

The collection was presented to the Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library by Mr. White's daughter, Janette H. White, in 1982. Miss White places no restriction on the use of the material.

CHRONOLOGY

16 Sept. 1884	Born at Edmonton (Now Snelgrove, Ont.). Son of James White, a Canadian naturalist, and Helen (Urquhart). Brother of J.H. White, Professor of Forestry, University of Toronto.
1891-1892	Student at Carthage Public School, Carthage, Ont.
1892-1897	Snelgrove Public School, Snelgrove, Ont.
1897-1901	Brampton High School, Brampton, Ont.
1901-1902	Brampton Model School for Teachers, Brampton, Ont.
1902-1907	Teacher, Sandhill Public School, Sandhill, Ont.
1902	White's first published works began to appear under the name Kismet and S.A. White-Kismet, in The Toronto Mail and Empire, The Toronto Sunday World, The Toronto Globe, and The Canadian Courier. White also began to publish a number of song lyrics, mostly through Harry Sparks, a Toronto music publisher, by 1907, writing under his own name.
1908-1915	Wrote numerous stories and poems for a variety of magazines, including Canadian Magazine, Canadian Courier, People's Magazine, Saturday Night, Bohemian, Gray Goose, Smart Set, Outing Magazine, Gunter's Magazine, etc.
1910	White's first novel published: The Stampeder, (Toronto: William Briggs).
1912	Publication of <u>The Wildcatters</u> ; <u>A Tale of Cobalt</u> , (Toronto: William Briggs).
28 Sept. 1912	White married Vennie Giffen, of Snelgrove, Ont.
1913	Empery; A Story of Love and Battle in Rupert's Land. (New York: Outing Publishing Co., Toronto: Musson).
1914-1918	Wrote numerous works for Adventure Magazine, including ten book-length novels and two long serials composed of ten installments each.
