YOUNG, Alfred, 1873-1940. Clergyman and lecturer.

Holograph notes on the algebra of invariants and the theory of groups.
A small amount of correspondence, mainly on the subject of mathematics.

Alfred Young was the rector of Birdbrook, Halstead, Essex. He lectured in Mathematics at Cambridge, where he taught Gilbert Robinson. He also patented at least two inventions in the field of electricity.
