Biographical Sketch: M.R. (Melvin Robert) Appell was born in Kitchener, Ont., in 1943. He has been writing poetry since the early 1960s. His work has appeared in *The Antigonish Review*, *The New Quarterly*, *Volume 63*, *Alive Magazine*, *Mountain*, *Weed*, and *The Canadian Review*, among other periodicals. In 1968, he won the Dorothy Shoemaker Award, judged by Irving Layton. He currently lives in Newfoundland.
